TIMBER SALE NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Bureau of Land Management will offer for sale timber as described herein for oral auction, pursuant to Instructions to Bidders, as stated on Form No. 5440-9 and subject to Notice of Requirement for Certification of Nonsegregated Facilities, Form No. 1140-4, attached. Written and oral bids will be received by the District Manager, or her representative, at the **EUGENE DISTRICT OFFICE**, **3106 PIERCE PARKWAY, SPRINGFIELD, OREGON**. The timber sale will commence at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, **February 14, 2013**.

This Timber Sale Notice does <u>not</u> constitute the decision document for purposes of protest and appeal of a forest management decision. Consistent with 43 CFR Subpart 5003 - Administrative Remedies, the notice of a timber sale, when published as a legal ad in a newspaper of general circulation shall constitute the decision document for purposes of protest and appeal. Protests may be filed with the Contracting Officer within 15 days of the publication of the aforementioned decision document in the newspaper. It is anticipated that the decision document will be published in <u>The Register-Guard</u> newspaper on or about <u>January 16, 2013</u>. BLM does not warrant publication on this exact date. All parties considering protest of the timber sale decision document are encouraged to review the aforementioned newspaper to ensure accurate knowledge of the exact publication date.

A WRITTEN BID on Form 5440-9 at not less than the appraised price on a unit basis per species and the required minimum bid deposit shall be required to participate in oral bidding for each tract.

THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER, as a condition of award, will be required to complete and/or sign the following forms:

- 1. Form 1140-6, a certification that the bid was arrived at by the bidder or offerer independently, and was tendered without collusion with any other bidder or offerer.
- 2. Form 1140-7, Equal Opportunity Affirmative Action Program Representation, for all contracts over \$10,000.
- 3. Form 1140-8, Equal Opportunity Compliance Report Certification.
- 4. Form 5450-17, Export Determination.

PRE-AWARD QUALIFICATIONS. The high bidder may be required to furnish information to determine the ability to perform the obligations of the contract. If the high bidder is determined not qualified, not responsible or refuses to respond within 15 days of a request for information pertaining to qualifications, the contract may be offered and awarded for the amount of the high bid to the highest of the bidders who is qualified, responsible, and willing to accept the contract.

A PERFORMANCE BOND in an amount not less than 20 percent of the total purchase price will be required for all contracts of \$2,500 or more, but the amount of the bond shall not be in excess of \$500,000, except when the Purchaser opts to increase the minimum bond as provided in 43 CFR 5451.2. A minimum performance bond of not less than \$500 will be required for all installment contracts less than \$2,500.

INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS may be authorized for sales of \$500 or more. Required installments will be determined by BLM. For sales under \$500,000, installments will not be less than 10% of the total purchase price. For sales of \$500,000 or more, installment payments shall be \$50,000.

LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION. All timber sales, including timber from Federal rights-of-ways, shall be

subject to the restrictions relating to the export and substitution of unprocessed timber from the United States in accordance with P.L. 94-165 and 43 CFR 5400 and 5424, as amended.

LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION RESTRICTIONS. Excepting Port-Orford-cedar, all timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

The BLM has revised the log export restrictions special provision to reduce the log branding and painting requirements. The new requirements include branding of one end of all logs with a scaling diameter of over 10 inches. All loads of 11 logs or more, regardless of the diameter of the logs, will have a minimum of 10 logs branded on one end. All logs will be branded on loads of 10 logs or less. One end of all branded logs will be marked with yellow paint. At the discretion of the Contracting Officer, the Purchaser may be required to brand and paint all logs. The Purchaser shall bear any increased costs for log branding and painting.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION concerning each timber sale tract described herein is available at the above District Office. A copy of the timber sale contract is also available for inspection at the District Office. This prospectus includes maps and tables that cannot be made Section 508 compliant. For help with its data or information, please contact the Eugene District Office at 541-683-6798.

THE VOLUMES LISTED herein are estimates only, based on 16-foot taper breaks, which must be taken into consideration if comparisons are made with volume predictions based on other standards. The volumes based on 32-foot taper breaks are shown for comparison purposes. No sale shall be made for less than the total purchase price, without regard to the amount bid per unit, even though quantity of timber actually cut or removed or designated for taking is more or less than the estimated volume or quantity so listed.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS were prepared for these sales, and Findings of No Significant Impact have been documented. These documents are available for inspection as background for these sales at the Eugene District Office.

ACCESS to a sale may be through a locked gate (see individual sale information). Prospective bidders may obtain a key from the Eugene District Office. Any other persons interested in visiting the timber sale site should first contact the District Office at 683-6600.

<u>APPRAISED PRICES</u> are calculated by determining market value through the analytical appraisal method. The minimum bid increment will be \$0.10 per MBF or multiples thereof.

<u>LOG EXPORT RESTRICTIONS</u>: All timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

<u>NOTE</u>: The volume for this timber sale has been calculated using 16 foot eastside Scribner rules, and the 32 foot log volumes and the cubic log volumes are estimates derived from the 16 foot volumes.

<u>CRUISE INFORMATION</u>: Volume for Douglas-fir in Partial Harvest Area No. 1 and the right-of-ways has been cruised using the 3P system to select sample trees. The sample trees have been cruised and the volume computed using the *National Cruise Processing Program* for estimating volume in 16 foot lengths and the volume expanded to a total Partial Harvest Area No. 1 and right-of-way volume. A map showing the location and description of these sample trees is available at the Eugene District Office. The timber volumes for all other conifers and hardwoods in the right-of-ways were based on a 100% cruise using the *National Cruise Processing Program* for estimating board foot volume of trees in 16 foot logs.

Volume for the coniferous species in Partial Harvest Areas No. 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 was variable plot cruised. Partial Harvest Areas No. 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 contain a total of 260 plots and 91 randomly selected sample trees. The tree count was determined with a Relaskop using a 20 BAF. Sample trees were randomly selected and volume expanded to a total Partial Harvest Area volume in 16-foot lengths using the *National Cruise Processing Program*. A map showing the location of the sample trees is available at the Eugene District Office.

With respect to merchantable Douglas-fir (sample) trees: The average tree is 11.9" DBHOB; the average log contains 35 bd. ft.; the total gross merchantable volume is approximately 3,637 MBF; and 94% recovery is expected.

<u>CUTTING AREA:</u> Six areas totaling approximately 361 acres must be partial harvested and approximately 7 acres of right-of-way must be clear cut.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is provided by:

- 1. A public road;
- 2. BLM existing roads;
- 3. BLM roads to be constructed;
- 4. Roads covered by a Right-of-Way and Road Use Agreement E-573 between Weyerhaeuser Company and the United States. In the use and renovation of private roads, the Purchaser shall enter into a license agreement with Weyerhaeuser Company. The license agreement shall be delivered to Weyerhaeuser Company for execution at least 15 days prior to any use of company roads. See the Prospectus for full terms and conditions of use.
- 5. Roads covered by a Right-of-Way and Road Use Agreement E-370 between Timber Service Company and the United States. In the use and renovation of private roads, the Purchaser shall enter into a license agreement with Timber Service Company. The license agreement shall be delivered to Timber Service Company for execution at least 15 days prior to any use of company roads. See the Prospectus for full terms and conditions of use.

ROAD MAINTENANCE: The Purchaser shall pay Weyerhaeuser Company road use fees of \$7,114.00. In addition, the Purchaser shall either maintain the Weyerhaeuser owned roads or Weyerhaeuser will maintain their roads and the Purchaser shall pay maintenance fees estimated at \$1,362.13. The Purchaser shall pay Weyerhaeuser Company rockwear fees estimated at \$834.47. The Purchaser shall spread 1 load of crushed rock in lieu of rockwear fees on Weyerhaeuser owned Road No. 15-1-11. The Purchaser shall spread 4 loads of crushed rock in lieu of rockwear fees on Timber Service Company owned Road No.14-1-34 Segs. A and C. Special Requirements in Road Renovation: Removal, replacement, and installation of stream culverts on Road Nos. 14-1-34 and 15-1-2 shall be done between June 1 and October 15 (both days inclusive). Removal, replacement, and installation of stream culverts on any other roads shall be done between July 15 and August 31 (both days inclusive). Prior to any renovation work on Road No. 14-1-35 Seg. B, lead-offs shall be constructed to drain wet areas located between Stas: 2+75 - 8+00. The Purchaser shall have the option to rock Spur 1H. Additional drainage features may be required as directed by the Authorized Officer. Any costs for rocking and installation of cross drains will be at the Purchaser's expense and shall conform to the 1-1/2" minus BLM gradation "A".

Special Requirements in Road Decommissioning: Operations limited to periods of dry weather. Removal of stream culverts shall be done between July 15 and August 31 (both days inclusive). Two culverts on Road No. 14-1-26 Seg. B2 must be removed afterharvest operations and shall be removed from BLM lands in a legal manner. Spurs that are optionally rocked shall not be decommissioned.

Total estimated cost of construction, renovation, and decommissioning: \$217,937.62

DURATION OF CONTRACT: Duration of the contract will be 36 months for cutting and removal of timber.

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road construction, road renovation, road maintenance, road decommissioning, logging methods, prevention of erosion, logging residue reduction, submission of a written logging plan specifying landing locations, logging methods, and logging schedule.

Under Sec. 25 of the timber sale contract, groundbased logging will be prohibited during periods of excessive soil moisture. This will normally limit groundbased logging to July, August and September.

It is estimated that 233 MBF additional timber, such as corridor and guyline trees may be removed under the contract, but is not included in the advertised sale volume, nor is it included in the timber sale appraisal.

A revised Special Provision, 42(d)(2)(cc), has been added to the contract which enables the Contracting Officer to allow the Purchaser to remove material from the Contract Area instead of disposing of slash by piling, covering and burning.

OTHER SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- In Partial Harvest Area No. 3 as shown on Exhibit A, no harvest activities, including felling, yarding, decking, hauling or road work shall be conducted from March 1 to July 15 of each year, both days inclusive. This restriction is for wildlife purposes and may be waived or modified (reduced or extended).
- 2. No felling, yarding, or loading is permitted in or through the Reserve Areas shown on Exhibit A.
- 3. Road renovation and hauling operations on native surface roads shall be restricted to dry periods (typically July 1 to September 30).
- 4. No yarding shall be conducted on the Partial Harvest Areas during sap flow from April 1 to June 15 of each year, both days inclusive, unless otherwise approved by the Authorized Officer.
- 5. The Purchaser shall provide a map of requested skyline and skid road locations a minimum of seven (7) working days in advance of cutting to obtain approval of the locations from the Authorized Officer.
- 6. Approximately 380 orange painted reserve trees are required for the creation of snags and coarse woody debris.
- 7. Corridors and skid trails may need to be adjusted to avoid cutting large trees 28 inches or greater DBH.
- 8. Purchaser shall pile logging slash at all landings and within 25 feet of the portion of Road Nos.14-1-35, 14-1-35.1, 14-1-35.2, 14-1-35.3, 14-1-35.7, 14-1-35.8, 15-1-1.3, 15-1-2, and 15-1-9 within the Partial Harvest Areas as directed by the Authorized Officer.

OPTIONAL CONTRIBUTION: The Purchaser will have the option of performing slash pile burning or contributing One Thousand One Hundred Seventy-six and 26/100 dollars (\$1,176.26) in lieu thereof. The option must be declared prior to contract execution. Piling and covering are not included in the Optional Contribution and will remain the responsibility of the Purchaser.

If the Purchaser has made such a contribution and later elects to remove all of the slash required to be piled, covered, and burned, the contribution will be refunded.



From Brownsville, travel 7.3 miles east on Highway 228. Turn south on Brush Creek Road and travel 4 miles to Road No. 14-1-33 (Childers Road). Turn east on Road No. 14-1-33 and travel approximately 0.9 miles to Road No. 14-1-34. Continue east on Road No. 14-1-34 for approximately 1.5 miles to the junction with Road No. 15-1-2. Turn north onto Road No. 15-1-2 and follow Timber Sale Location signs to the Partial Harvest Areas.





The sample trees have been cruised and the volume computed using the **National Cruise Processing Program** for estimating volume in 16 foot lengths and the volume expanded to a total Partial Harvest Area volume. A map showing the location and description of these sample trees is available at the Eugene District Office.

With respect to merchantable Douglas-fir (sample) trees: The average tree is 10.3" DBHOB; the average log contains 29 bd. ft.; the total gross merchantable volume is approximately 598 MBF; and 99% recovery is expected.

Proceed approximately 10 miles and turn east onto Wendling Road. Continue approximately 0.3 miles and head east onto Cartwright Creek Road. Proceed approximately 0.5 miles to gate then follow signs to the sale area.




