

**RECORD OF PLAN CONFORMANCE AND
CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION (CX) DETERMINATION

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED ACTION (INCLUDING PURPOSE AND NEED)

Communication site users want to utilize the road built by FAA to Stukel Mountain Communication site (see attached map Exhibit A). The road starts at County Road 566 in Section 5, ending at the communication site in Section 15 and is 6.6 miles in length and 30 ft. wide. There is no alternate public route that can be used. This document covers several different users that utilize this access to Stukel Mountain Communication Site. Road use is needed year-round including the period between November 1, and April 15th when the area is typically closed to non-authorized motorized travel. Users must be able to access the site to repair equipment malfunctions. This permit will allow communication site users to access the area all year.

IMPLEMENTATION DATE

This project is expected to be implemented in February 2008.

Remarks: Road is used during closure months from Nov. 1, thru April 15th. However, this permit will allow communication site users to access the area during the closure period. Surveys for cultural resources are not required unless maintenance is proposed.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND CX DETERMINATION

The proposed action would not create adverse environmental impacts or require the preparation of an environmental assessment (EA) or environmental impact statement (EIS). The proposed action has been reviewed against the criteria for an Exception to a categorical exclusion (listed above) as identified in 516 DM 2, Appendix 2, and does not meet any Exception. The application of this categorical exclusion is appropriate, as there are no extra ordinary circumstances potentially having effects that may significantly affect the environment. The proposed action is, therefore, categorically excluded from additional NEPA documentation.
