I recently heard of a new trail being developed in Rogue River for hikers and bikers but horse riders were not considered. Although you have not had the response from riders that you expected, many of us were not aware of the trails being developed. There are limited developed trails without having to drive 2 hours or so to go to the mountains, so I beg that you consider adding horseback riding to allowable options on your trails. Speaking from experience, riders are consider of trails, assist in development and maintenance of them, and make sure their parking area is keep clean when they leave. As illustrated at Cathedral Hills, riders exist along with bikers and hikers without incident and regularly use the trails. As I said, we have limited trails without having to drive great distances so i hope you will consider allowing horseriders into your new trails.
