

Brown Road and Razorback Post-Fire Herbicide Application



Target plants: N. Africa grass,
cheatgrass and Medusahead rye

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Prineville District will be applying the herbicide imazapic from October 24—Nov. 8, 2013 (weather dependent) to several thousand acres of non-native and invasive plants in areas burned by the 2011 Brown Road, Hancock and Razorback wildfires. We will be using both aerial (helicopter) and ground-based methods.

Spraying will occur on BLM lands between Highway 197 and the Lower Deschutes River in the Criterion area, on BLM land east of the Deschutes River near Pine Tree and Twin Springs campgrounds and on BLM land west of the John Day River, north and south of Nwy 218 near Clarno.

For safety, neighboring residents and the public should stay out of these areas during spraying and for 12 hours after spraying is complete. All public entrances to these lands will be posted with herbicide and closure information.
