Maston Area Trailhead Project

This site is the location of the future Maston Trailhead, which will provide access to equestrian, pedestrian and mountain bike trails planned for this portion of the Cline Buttes Recreation Area.

The Maston Trailhead will accommodate approximately 25 single vehicles and eighteen horse trailers. There will be a restroom provided and a small picnic area located west of the trailhead.

The area where the trailhead is proposed was cleared for agriculture at some point in the past, most likely between 1910 and 1930 when the surrounding lands were made available for sale through the Carey Act, which promoted sale and settlement of these lands through privately funded irrigation projects.

Some of the future trails in the Maston area are routed along relic canals built during that early period of land sales. These ditches were constructed by hand labor and horse teams.

The roughly 4,000 acre Maston Area is closed to motorized vehicle use. Future trail development projects will provide for a separated system of equestrian and mountain bike trails. The Deschutes River Canyon is managed for pedestrian trail use only.
