Portions of Tioga Segment of North Umpqua Trail Closed

Due to a series of landslides and washouts, the Bureau of Land Management has announced that a 2-mile section of the Tioga Segment on the North Umpqua Trail will be closed until further notice.

Beginning at the Swiftwater Trailhead, the closure area is from the location of the old, bridge piers at milepost 28 on Highway 138 to the Nezie Creek Bridge, which is across the river from Susan Creek Campground.

About the BLM:
