Temporary Road Closure at BLM's North Bank Habitat Management Area

Roseburg, OR – Restoration and maintenance work is planned throughout the summer months for the Bureau of Land Management's North Bank Habitat Management Area, north west of Glide. Through an assistance agreement with the BLM, the Partnership for Umpqua Rivers will be replacing the Jackson Creek culvert located on the Powerline Road (26-4-4.8). The culvert is being replaced to improve fish passage on the east fork of Jackson Creek. This work will be on-going throughout the summer until September 1, 2010.

The Powerline Road will be closed during this time. In addition, Pacific Power will be in the area working on power lines this summer and fall. No road closures are anticipated from that work. For more information contact Chip Clough at (541) 440-4930
