## Road Closure Due to Culvert Replacement

**Roseburg, Ore.** – The Roseburg District, Bureau of Land Management will close road 24.4.22 near Gossett Creek, eight miles Northeast of Oakland, Oregon. The closure will begin on August 15, and will continue through August 19, 2016, to complete replacement of a failing culvert.

Culvert replacement will include installation of fish weirs and streambed simulation throughout the culvert to assist in fish passage.

During the culvert replacement, the road will be impassable to traffic. The public is advised to seek alternate routes during this time. A map of the culvert location is included with this release.
