## BLM Lifts Campfires Restrictions

**Salem, Ore.**— Due to cooler temperatures and rainfall, the BLM has lifted the elevated fire restriction on lands managed by the Salem District's Cascades Field Office. Campfires are now allowed in designated metal fire rings at recreation sites. Oregon Department of Forestry regulated use restrictions remain in effect.
