S-133, Look Up, Look Down, Look Around • 4 hours • \$59

Examines the wildland fire environment and the indicators firefighters should observe on the fire line in order to anticipate fire behavior.

S-131, Firefighter Type 1 • 8 hours • \$89

Interactive in nature, this eight-hour course is designed to meet the training needs of the FFT1. Contains tactical decision games designed to facilitate learning the objectives and class discussion. Topics include fireline reference materials, communications, and tactical decision making.

S-234, Ignition Operations • 16 hours • \$149

An entry-level course providing training in the functional roles and responsibilities connected with firing operations. Covers planning, ignition procedures and techniques, and equipment applicable wildland and prescribed fire. The course also addresses the role of the ignition specialist or firing boss as the organization manages escalation from a non-complex to a complex fire situation.
