

**Categorical Exclusion Documentation for All Projects Other
Than Hazardous Fuels and Fire Rehabilitation Projects**

Proposed Action Title/Type: State of Oregon Communication Site Lease – High Heaven

Location of Proposed Action: T3S, R5W, Sec. 33 – High Heaven Lookout

Land Use Allocation(s): Adaptive Management Area (AMA)

Description of Proposed Action:

The State of Oregon is requesting a Communication Site Lease from the BLM on lands located in T3S, R5W, Sec. 33. This area is referred to as High Heaven Lookout by the BLM which was once the location of a fire lookout. The State is proposing to add its communication equipment within the existing footprint of the site currently occupied by Yamhill County, Oregon (BLM Right-of-Way Grant OR 172). The proposed action would include the addition of a new 11.5ft x 23.5ft equipment shelter and 1,000 gallon propane tank. The State will use Yamhill County's existing tower. The lease period would be for 20 years.

B. Land Use Plan Conformance:

The proposed action is in conformance with the *Salem District Record of Decision and Resource Management Plan*, dated May 1995; *Record of Decision for Amendments to Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management Planning Documents Within the Range of the Northern Spotted Owl and Standard and Guidelines for Management of Habitat for Late-Successional and Old-Growth Forest Related Species Within the Range of the Northern Spotted Owl*, dated April, 1994 (p. C-37); *Record of Decision and Standards and Guidelines for Amendments to the Survey and Manage, Protection Buffer, and other Mitigation Measures Standards and Guidelines*, January, 2001; ESA (Endangered Species Act of 1972, as amended); *Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act of 1996*, as amended; and *BLM Manual 6840 Special Status Species Policy*.

The proposed action is in conformance with the Land Use Plan (LUP) because it is specifically provided for in the following decision(s):

- “Continue to make BLM-administered lands available to needed rights-of-way where consistent with local comprehensive plans, Oregon statewide planning goals and rules, and the exclusion and avoidance areas identified in this resource management plan.” (1995 RMP p. 55).

C. Compliance with the Endangered Species Act:

No habitat exists within the proposed project area for any species listed under the Endangered Species Act, nor does the project area lie within the boundaries of critical habitat for any listed species. Consequently, the proposed action would not result in any impacts to listed species therefore ESA consultation is not required.

D. Compliance with NEPA:

The Proposed Action is categorically excluded from further documentation under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) in accordance with 516 DM 11.9.E 12, which allows for “Grants of right-of-way wholly within the boundaries of other compatibly developed rights-of-way.”

This categorical exclusion is appropriate in this situation because there are no extraordinary circumstances potentially having effects that may significantly affect the environment. The proposed action has been reviewed, and none of the extraordinary circumstances described in 43 CFR 46.215 apply, as shown on the following table:

The proposed action has been reviewed, and none of the extraordinary circumstances described in 516 DM 2 (see Table 1, above) apply.


The proposed action would not affect the elements of the environment described above; therefore there is no potential for significant impacts. No additional mitigation measures are required.




