<u>CRUISE INFORMATION</u>: The timber volumes were based on a variable plot cruise for estimating the board foot volume of trees. Plots were measured using a 20 basal area factor (BAF) for partial cut units. None of the total sale volume is salvage material. With respect to merchantable trees of all species; the average DBHOB is 12.8 inches; the average gross merchantable log contains 48 bf; the total gross volume is approximately 4,420 MBF; and 95% recovery is expected. The Right-of-Way volume is based on a 100% cruise for estimating the board foot volume of trees.

<u>CUTTING AREA</u>: Four (4) units totaling approximately two hundred eighteen (218) acres shall be partial cut and three (3) acres of right-of-way shall be cut. Acres shown on Exhibit A have been computed using a Trimble

Geo XT Global Positioning System receiver. Acreage was calculated based on Global Positioning System traverse procedures including differential correction.

DURATION OF CONTRACT: Will be thirty-six (36) months for cutting and removal of timber.

LOCATION: To Units in Section 24, 25 and 30: From Lyons, Oregon on Highway 22 head East to North Fork Road SE. A key is required to access the units within these sections. Turn northeast onto North Fork Road SE. Travel approximately 11 miles to the Fawn Creek Road. Turn northwest onto Fawn Creek Road. Travel approximately 1.5 miles on Fawn Creek Road SE to arrive at northeast boundary corner of unit #2. To continue to unit #3 continue traveling east onto the 9-3E-11 road for approximately 2,000 feet to reach the west boundary of unit #3. To continue to unit #1 continue to travel east on the 9-3E-11 road through unit #3. Travel for approximately 2.5 miles and take the left fork which continues the 9-3E-11 road to arrive to the west boundary of unit #1.

<u>To Units in Section 29:</u> From Lyons, Oregon on Highway 22 head East to North Fork Road SE. A key is not required to access the units within this section. Turn northeast onto North Fork Road SE. Travel approximately 11 miles to the Evan's Mountain Road SE. Turn north onto Evan's Mountain Road SE. Travel for approximately 1.5 miles on Evan's Mountain Road SE to arrive at the southwest boundary corner of Unit 5. To reach unit #4 continue traveling on Evan's Mountain Road SE and then go northeast onto 8-4E-30 road. Continue on 8-4E-30 road for approximately 1 mile to arrive at west boundary corner of unit #4.

ACCESS AND ROAD MAINTENANCE:

Gate keys are required for access. Prospective bidders may obtain a key from the Salem District Office, Monday through Friday from 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. CREDIT CARD is required at the time of checking out a key. A \$50.00 charge will apply if key is not returned.

Purchaser maintenance shall include frequent blading and shaping of road surface; ditch, culvert, and catch basin cleaning; removal of minor slides and other debris. Roads shall be left in a condition to withstand adverse weather at the end of the seasonal operations.

Alternate access is available but will require a contract modification. Contact District personnel for more detailed information.

In the use of the Bureau of Land Management controlled roads which the Purchaser is authorized to use, the Purchaser shall pay maintenance and rockwear obligation of Twelve thousand fifty and 67/100 dollars, (\$12,050.67) to the Bureau of Land Management. The Purchaser is required to maintain all Bureau of Land Management controlled roads except 8-4E-31 segments A-D2 as indicated on Exhibit E map.

In the use of Longview Timberlands, LLC controlled road which the Purchaser is authorized to use, the Purchaser shall enter into a license agreement with Longview Timberlands and pay to Longview a road use fee of Two thousand one-hundred ninety-six and 00/100 dollars, (\$2,196.00) and a road maintenance and rockwear fee of One thousand eight-hundred twenty-seven and 51/100 dollars, (\$1,827.51). The Purchaser is required to carry liability insurance with limits of \$1,000,000/\$1,000,000/\$1,000,000 and a \$1,000.00 performance bond.

<u>ROAD CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATION</u>: The purchaser will be required to do all work set forth below. The purchaser shall supply all materials unless otherwise indicated.

Debris shall be disposed of by scattering and setting aside large woody debris for road closures on roads P2, P3 and 8-4E-29.1 Segment C near entrances.

- Asphalt repair on 8-4E-32 20 Tons.
- Construct 80 feet of ditch on 9-3E-11.
- Construct 4 barricades for decommissioning (P2, P3, 8-4E-29.1 and 8-4E-30 Segment C).

DESIGNATION AND SALE OF ADDITIONAL TIMBER (Sec. 42.c.1-5)

This contract contains provisions for the sale and removal of additional timber necessary to facilitate safe and efficient purchaser operations. These provisions include:

- -The designation and sale of additional timber, such as corridor and guyline trees, at contract price, as necessary to facilitate safe and efficient logging. Such trees may be felled and removed when they are painted by the Authorized Officer;
- -Sale of additional timber volume at current fair market value where the species and/or size of trees are not representative of the forest stand(s) being thinned;
- -Government reservation of trees previously marked for cutting (replacement) when the Authorized Officer determines that it is necessary in order to maintain stand densities consistent with objectives set forth in management prescriptions;
 - -The use of unilateral modifications executed by BLM for such additional timber and replacement timber;
- -Revocation of the purchaser's right to cut additional timber if the Authorized Officer determines that trees have been cut and removed that were not previously marked and approved for cutting and removal by the Authorized Officer; and,
- -It is estimated that approximately 422 MBF of such additional timber may be removed under the contract, but is not included in the advertised sale volume nor was it included in the timber sale appraisal
