Monetary Reward Offered for Vandalism Information

Spokane, Wash. – The Bureau of Land Management’s (BLM) Border Field Office is offering a monetary reward in exchange for information leading to the conviction of suspects responsible for vandalism at the Twin Lakes Recreation Site in central Lincoln County.

On April 10, 2011, a local game warden discovered excessive littering and vandalism of a vault toilet building at the Twin Lakes Recreation Site. The incident is estimated to have occurred on or about April 9, 2011. The damage includes destruction of vault toilet facilities, bullet holes in the door and walls, and excessive littering throughout the recreation site.

The BLM is offering a monetary award to the individual(s) who offers information leading to the successful conviction of suspects responsible for the damage. The reward will be paid out upon conviction of the suspect(s).

The staff and financial resources used to repair the damage at the Twin Lakes Recreation Site would have otherwise been used to maintain and/or enhance local recreation opportunities.
