Rocks, Islands and Isolation: Wilderness Character Inventory challenges and opportunities for the Eastern Washington and San Juan Islands Resource Management Plan Revision



Rocks and islands pose an interesting challenge regarding the size criterion for wilderness inventory and management. Section 2(c) of the Wilderness Act of 1964 (PL 88-577) describes wilderness as “an area of undeveloped Federal land ... which (1) generally appears to have been affected by the forces of nature, with the imprint of man’s work substantially unnoticeable; (2) has outstanding opportunities for solitude or a primitive and unconfined type of recreation; (3) has at least five thousand acres of land or is of sufficient size as to make practicable its preservation and use in an unimpaired condition; and (4) may also contain ecological, geological, or other features of scientific, educational, scenic, or historical value.” Agencies draw their wilderness inventory criteria from this description, holding that roadless areas must meet minimum size, naturalness and outstanding opportunities criteria in order to possess wilderness characteristics.

Most wilderness practitioners are familiar with “interior” or “mainland” wilderness values, which are generally self-contained within a vast landscape meeting the Wilderness Act’s minimum size criterion. But Congress made an exception for “roadless islands” (e.g., Federal Land Policy & Management Act, Section 603(a)), which have no minimum size requirement. Lacking the usual “wide open spaces” from which to assess the remaining criteria, natural islands and offshore rocks pose a challenge to specialists attempting to inventory or manage for “outstanding opportunities for solitude or a primitive and unconfined type of recreation.”



Offshore rocks and islands are often natural in appearance, but the smaller, more barren rocks offer few opportunities for primitive recreation. Such areas must therefore provide outstanding opportunities for solitude to meet minimum Wilderness Act criteria. The accepted practice of considering the capacity for visitors to be isolated from one another, using

such factors as size and vegetative or topographic screening, doesn’t fit the rocks/islands concept. Yet Congress provided the specific exception and has, on many occasions, designated small, offshore rocks and islands as wilderness. Applying an alternative perception of solitude—not isolation from other visitors, but from the surrounding world—gives meaning to the size exception. Such an approach, however, places greater weight on the influence of outside sights and sounds, which are rarely to be applied to mainland wilderness evaluations (House Report 95-540, July 1977, accompanying the Endangered American Wilderness Act).



Wilderness inventory guidance has cautioned against using outside sights and sounds unless they are of “major significance” with “direct effects on the lands under study” (BLM Wilderness Inventory Handbook, September 1978). In essence, they can be considered when they “overwhelm” the primitive setting and the ability to feel isolated from the outside world. Since relatively small rocks and islands are generally more exposed and, thus, vulnerable to outside influences, the magnitude and effect of surrounding activities or developments play a major role in both inventorying and managing for island wilderness values.

As a result, inventories of undeveloped rocks and islands need only determine whether nearby developments or activities overwhelm the island’s primitive setting to reach a conclusion regarding outstanding opportunities for solitude. When managing wilderness islands, particularly in light of Congress’ explicit prohibition on use of wilderness “buffers,” it is incumbent on managing agencies to fully evaluate effects of proposed outside activities on wilderness values and to carefully explore mitigation measures that can meet the needs of the proposal with the least impact on the island’s wilderness values.
