Whereas, William Werner one of the companions of Lewis and Clarke has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Palmyra, Missouri whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Werner

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for North east quarter of Section Twenty five, of Township Fifty eight, of Range six west, and the south west quarter of Section seventeen, of Township Fifty eight, of Range five west, in the district of lands offered for sale at Palmyra, Missouri, containing Three hundred and Twenty acres.

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William Werner

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William Werner

and to his heirs the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging; unto the said William Werner and his heirs and assigns forever.
