### National Current Situation

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 124 fires reported. No new large fires were reported. Three large fires were contained, one in the Northwest Area, and two in the Eastern Great Basin Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

A Presidential Disaster Declaration was issued on 8/29 for Hurricane Katrina in Mississippi, Alabama and Louisiana. Two Area Command Teams are assigned (Williams-Rhodes and Ribar). Williams-Rhodes' Team is providing Incident Management Team coordination for FEMA Region IV at the Regional Response Coordination Center in Atlanta, GA for Hurricane Katrina Support. Ribar's Team is assigned to the Louisiana Emergency Operations Center in Baton Rouge, LA. The Team is coordinating activities of the Incident Management Teams in FEMA Region VI. Numerous resources are being mobilized as part of the relief effort.

### PNW Update

#### No Red Flags or FWW's for 9/12 issued

#### New Suppression for 9/11:

Minimal initial attack today due to cooler and moister conditions throughout the region. A small number of lightning strikes were recorded throughout Southeastern Oregon, but were either accompanied by showers, or high temperatures just never got warm enough for a long enough period of time yesterday afternoon for new starts to develop. Some holdovers may be possible, but with only 19 strikes total it is doubtful that anything significant would develop. Conditions throughout the region will continue to warm and dry today, but present models indicate another system moving through towards the end of next week, however, some forecasts indicate some return to late summer weather for 9/18-20.

**7 new fires were reported for 2 acres. Ongoing large fires added 0 acres for a total of 2 acres for the day.**

New Large Fires: None reported at this time.

#### Ongoing Suppression :

**WA-NES-320                      Squaw Creek Fire                      1100 acres                      100% containment**

This fire is burning in timber, brush, and grass approx. two and a half miles southwest of Methow, WA, which is about 17+ miles south of Twisp, WA. **On 9/11:** Fire was declared contained at 1800 after very minimal activity today. Transition back to local unit and demobilization of all remaining resources is anticipated for the next operational period.

**OR-PRD-811                      Pine Stub Fire                      597 acres                      100% containment**

This fire originally began as the Pine Stub RX Burn, but the portion identified as a slop-over

from the main fire has been declared a wildfire as of 1808 hours on 9/8. **On 9/11:** Two engines remain on the fire for patrol and mop-up activities. Demobe of the fire has been completed at 1800, and the fire has been declared controlled. Fire activity today was minimal, the only activity consisting of smoldering in duff.
