**BLM State-Specific Web Site Reconnected in Oregon and Washington**

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in Oregon and Washington is pleased to announce that its web site is now back on line at a new internet address [www.blm.gov/or](http://www.blm.gov/or). As the BLM completes its first round of web site reconnections of State-specific information sites, many of the other BLM State Office web sites are also once again available on the Internet. In addition, the BLM's Wild Horse and Burro Information site is also now available. The Bureau originally disconnected these sites so that site security could be improved.

The BLM recognizes the impact of this disconnection to its customers and thanks them for their patience and understanding during this period. The internet disconnect has posed challenges, but making sure that all constituents receive timely information about the agency's actions has been a priority for the entire agency.

The BLM is now concentrating on reconnecting sites that provide interactive non-Indian Trust data and services. Unfortunately, sites of this kind are more complex and time consuming to reconnect. Additional announcements will be made as other sites are reconnected. Specifically, the BLM in Oregon and Washington will be working on bringing its 10 District (Burns, Coos Bay, Eugene, Lakeview, Medford, Prineville, Roseburg, Salem, Spokane, and Vale) and two interpretive centers (National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center in Baker City, Oregon, and Yaquina Head Outstanding Natural Area Interpretive Complex, in Newport, Oregon) internet pages back online.
