Program Descriptions:

Where the Buffalo (Bison) Roam: This 35 minute PowerPoint presentation looks at the quintessential American icon, how we brought the animal to the brink of extinction and where it stands today.

Geology, Climatology, & its Effects on Plant Communities: Accompany an Interpreter on a short 40 minute stroll around the grounds or relax in our Leo Adler Theater for an Interpretive presentation on the geology of Oregon and its effects on climate and the corresponding plant communities.

All About Oxen: Take a look into the most prominent beast of burden on the Oregon Trail in a 30 minute PowerPoint presentation.

Labor Day Wagon Encampment: Join in three days of fun at our Wagon Encampment where you will see a group of pioneers resting on the Oregon Trail, and observe Bullwhackin' Kass with her team of oxen! Taste Dutch Oven Style foods prepared over a campfire. See living history interpreters demonstrate crafts and skills. Try your luck panning for gold, listen to some music, and play with pioneer toys and games.

Ray Egan Presents Ezra Meeker: Learn about vigorous 96 year old Meeker and his views of the Oregon Trail experience, as portrayed by Ray Egan.

Ray Egan Presents Willis Boatman: The true-life experience of this pioneer's trail and early settlement interpreted by Ray Egan.

Auburn, Oregon Town of Promise: A 30 minute slide presentation on the pioneering gold camp town of Auburn in Baker County, which started the gold rush to Eastern Oregon in the 1860's and disappeared soon thereafter.

Michael Terry: An American Indian historian demonstrates and discusses the way of life, traditions, weapons, tools, dress and equipment of the Great Plains Indian tribes. He makes all of his props in the traditional ways of the Native Americans and shares this information with his audiences. This interactive program is fascinating and educational for adults and children alike.

In the Leo Adler Theater:

Special interest videos on historical subjects, regional interest topics, and natural history shown daily.

Outdoors:

Demonstrations on gold panning and pioneer crafts, special interest hikes offered depending on weather and availability of interpreters. Check marquee in lobby for daily schedule.
