Living History and Live Presentations

Connections with the Land – Native American storytelling and music presented by Phillip Charrette. Phillip will use music and oral traditions to portray the connection of the native peoples of Oregon to the land. This program is part of the “**Oregon is Indian Country**” traveling exhibit from the Oregon Historical Society sponsored by the Baker County Library, Crossroads Art Center and National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center. This is a one hour program in the Leo Adler Theatre.

Equine or Bovine: Interpreter Calvin Henshaw portrays Alfred Shaw, a pioneer pondering the pros and cons of different draft animals. See how he made the choice of which to use to power his wagon across the country. 20 Minutes
