PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Albert Fenner: “Supplier to the Compleat Miner” Living history interpreter David Jason portrays Albert Fenner, Mining Supplier, while providing insight into the life of a mid 19th century business man.

Equine or Bovine: Interpreter Calvin Henshaw portrays a pioneer pondering the pros and cons of different draft animals. See how he made the choice of which animal to use to power his wagon across the country.

The Original Meals on Wheels: NHOTIC Interpreter Rachael Nickens presents a 30 minute program in the Leo Adler Theater exploring the methods by which Pioneers preserved, prepared, and partitioned food on the Oregon Trail.

“Probably George” Malvern: “The Varied and Startling Adventures of a Mountain Man”, true life experiences and tall tales in an adventurous 30 minute living history program by David Jason.

Women of the Oregon Trail: Join Interpreter Rachael Nickens for a 40 minute interpretive talk on the roles of women traveling the Oregon Trail.

Oregon Bounty Harvest Days: A two day celebration of the rich harvests of Oregon, from historic times to the present day. Demonstrations of pioneer cooking and modern dutch-oven cooking. Sample both modern and heirloom varieties of regionally grown fruits and vegetables, and find out how they came to Oregon. Displays and demonstrations on the natural bounty from eastern Oregon and early day food sources of the Native Americans.

Oregon Day of Culture - October 8th, the Interpretive Center will join with other Baker City cultural venues such as Crossroads Art Center, Baker Heritage Museum, and Baker County Public Library to offer special programs celebrating the arts, heritage, and humanities in Oregon - part of a statewide event coordinated by the Oregon Cultural Trust.

In the Leo Adler Theater: Special interest videos on historical subjects, regional interest topics, and natural history shown daily.

Flagstaff Gallery: Special Exhibit - “Borders and Boundaries: Two Centuries of Mapping Oregon”
Reproductions and originals of historic maps that chart the exploration and development of Oregon from earliest exploration up to modern times.
