Program Descriptions

Kilts Askew: Carla Carnegie and friends will set your toes-a-tappin' with their high energy Celtic and traditional tunes.

National Trails Day: Help commemorate this special day to “Experience Your Outdoors” and preserve the historic Oregon Trail with a guided walk beside ruts of the Trail. Walk with BLM archeologist, historian, and a botanist offering insight to the Trail and surrounding areas. Drinks and snacks will be available; bring a hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and light jacket.

Old Melodeon Minstrels: Chris Bayer and the Old Melodeon Minstrels bring you Gold Rush songs from the 1850s and 1860s, Chris Bayer and the Minstrels sing, dance and play old time banjo, penny whistle, washtub bass, singing and dancing.

On Her Own: Marian Brown portrays Lavinia Fordham, traveling west with her chickens to meet her husband who is already in the west.

The Donner Party: A remarkable, in depth account of the ill-fated wagon train. 84 minutes.

The Gold Rush: This award winning historical documentary film traces the epic saga of the bold adventurers who profoundly changed a young nation—and redefined the American Dream.

In Search of the Oregon Trail: This exceptional film gives an overview of the Oregon Trail story through interviews with noted historians and diary quotes. Beautifully filmed in historic locations. Part one and two 90 minutes each.

Lewis and Clark Confluence of Time and Courage: Journey back 200 years and follow in the footsteps of Captains Meriwether Lewis and William Clark as they explore the unknown.

Oregon Ghost Towns: A road trip through Oregon, visiting towns and sites that are becoming just memories, as well as some that have seen “new life”.

The Story of the Oregon Trail: This film chronicles the great 1840's trek across the unsettled American west. One hour.

West to Oregon: This colorful production takes you on a voyage of discovery along the actual route of the old overland trail. One hour.

Flagstaff Gallery

“Discovering the Nature of the West” through June 18th: highlights some of the earliest American & European naturalists and explorers who documented species of plants and animals “new” to western science while mapping the Pacific Northwest. Military expeditions, trappers, traders, and settlers all made significant contributions. The exhibit examines how these “new” species were collected, documented, and named.
