
June 28 – Don't Trash Our Future

Pan for gold, explore the stamp mill and discover how gold is formed through geologic forces - includes a volcanic eruption!




July 12 – Batty for Bats

Staff from the Ladd Marsh discuss why its important to band birds, and how to identify different birds from their skulls




July 26 – The Pollinator

Maps, compass and binoculars in hand, this Thursday will be all about orienteering




August 16 – Our Bird Community
