My idea of a successful plan is where the extraction effort is separated from the timber industry. Resources are cut and collected according to restoration guidelines, by loggers/workers contracted by the BLM. This means a delicate touch in the forest and profit margins stay out of public lands. At independent collection locations timber representatives can purchase the various small diameter logs and other resources. Allowing industry into the forest no matter what restrictions you place on them will result in less restoration. The laws of capitalism will require them to skip over the smaller profit efforts, which may be key in restoration. If the BLM cannot contract these loggers then at least they should be trained and certified by the BLM in restoration science. I also think we need to start publicizing the basics: the big trees need to stay. I assume that's what you mean by 'fire resilience' so lets just say it. That will help your cause.
