

## **Resource Management Plans for Western Oregon BLM Needs Your Feedback – Comment Form**

### **What would a successful plan look like to you?**

No clearcutting/ Also especially no cutting of old growth or mixed stands.

### **What kind of management should BLM do more/less of?**

The forest can likely manage itself. Let the trees grow large before deforesting again.

### **What is the appropriate geographic scale and scope of the plan?**

DO NOT USE BLM land or forest as a farm for the timber industry.

### **What new or innovative ideas should BLM consider in this planning process?**

Do not use forests for timber (building supplies). Find other products for building materials - possibly hemp.

### **In regards to the resources BLM manages:**

- **What is the appropriate mix of old, mid-aged, and young forests on BLM lands and how should these forests be managed?**

Do not touch anywhere there is old growth. Clearcutting not allowed.

Don't Clearcut

Thin younger stands

Don't not log especially near waterways or steep slopes.

No motorized vehicles. Consider charging parking or usage fees.
