

Resource Management Plans for Western Oregon BLM Needs Your Feedback – Comment Form

What would a successful plan look like to you?

A lot less cutting, more public recreation opportunities, gates open for access. Very limited areas for dirt bikes etc. to run.

What kind of management should BLM do more/less of?

More connectivity of parcels on W. side of Lane Co. Spotted Owl area, too.

What is the appropriate geographic scale and scope of the plan?

What new or innovative ideas should BLM consider in this planning process?

Use the old growth to collect pollution. Pay folks Not to cut older trees. Limit Mid and younger growth trees being cut. Make incentives for logging to create value in this country – not ship logs overseas.

In regards to the resources BLM manages:

- **What is the appropriate mix of old, mid-aged, and young forests on BLM lands and how should these forests be managed?**

As much of the old as possible should be protected! Light thinning – by hand, not large machines.

- **How should BLM provided habitat for fish and wildlife and contribute to the recovery of Endangered Species Act listed species?**

Do not allow thinner buffer along roads, less than 200' deep, and especially along creeks.

- **How should BLM manage forests to protect property and ensure our forests are fire resilient?**

Put people to work thinning by hand. Make property owners create fire-block situations for own properties.

- **How should BLM-administered lands be managed to contribute to clean water and safe drinking water?**

Larger buffers, connecting all areas between cuts, and along roads. Keep large compacting machinery out.

- **How should BLM manage for recreation in western Oregon?**

Allow people to pass through gates, by foot if necessary. We own the land and should be able to access.

- **How can BLM lands contribute to local economies and support local communities?**

Put people to work doing hard work.
