Dear Folks at BLM,

I am writing out of extreme concern for your draft EIS Western Oregon Plan Revisions.

I would like to urge you to implement increased protection for all old-growth forests and river and wetland habitats, certainly not less, as proposed in your "preferred alternative" (Alternative 2), which is in direct opposition to the legal implementation of the Northwest Forest Plan, The Endangered Species Act, The Clean Water Act, as well as Oregon's State Water Quality Standards.

I am outraged that you have proposed clear cutting. It is obvious to me what a disaster clear cutting has wreaked on our forests, both public and private. There are countless forests that will never recover. How could you consider adding to that? Please eliminate the proposal of clear cutting.

The proposal of over 1000 miles of new roads spells further disaster to streams, rivers, creeks and salmon habitat, in addition to drinking water quality. Our waterways and our salmon are already endangered. Please do not build any more roads.

According to the analysis of Alternative 2, the BLM forests would become less resistant to the threat of fire. The threat of forest fire is already enormous.

Please, please come to your senses and be the protective stewards of our precious, dwindling old-growth forests, and precious waterways, that you are meant to be. Please take a stand to protect our beautiful, precious, irreplaceable Northwest.
