Section 205 of HR 1424/PL 110-343
Application for Resource Advisory Committee Membership

The Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000 (PL106-393) as amended in 2008 (PL 110-343), creates a mechanism for local community collaboration with federal land management agencies in the selection of projects to be conducted on federal lands or that will benefit resources on federal lands. Resource Advisory Committees (Committees) consist of 15 local citizens representing an array of interests. The Committees will review proposed projects and make recommendations to the land management agencies. Funding for Committee projects is provided by participating county governments. The geographic boundaries of Oregon's five BLM Resource Advisory Committees are determined by BLM district boundaries. Applicants must reside in Oregon, and where practicable, reside within a county that is within the boundaries of the Committees(s) on which membership is sought.

Resource Advisory Committee members are appointed by the Secretary of the Interior. The Secretary will choose individuals to serve as Committee members from among those nominated by the counties as well as those who are nominated by other interests and organizations or who apply directly to the BLM. Selection by the Secretary of the Interior will be guided in part by the following statements by Mr. Combest and Mr. Stenholm, the Chairman and the Ranking Minority Member, of the House Committee on Agriculture:

“Because the success of each advisory committee will depend largely on the cooperation of its members, it is expected that the Secretary will appoint to resource advisory committees only individuals who have a demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with others of differing viewpoints and achieve good faith compromise.”

“It is the intent of the House sponsors that members of resource advisory committees be selected from within local communities. Section 205(d)(4) provides that “the Secretary concerned shall ensure local representation in each category.”
