HIGH IMPACT camping is damaging, may be illegal, and is expensive to clean up.



GOOD CAMP

LOW IMPACT camping minimizes your impact and leaves a clean camp for the next visitors.



HELP PROTECT THE RIVER RESOURCES AND SAVE TAX DOLLARS.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE LOW-IMPACT CAMPING PRACTICES TO MINIMIZE THE TRACES OF YOUR STAY:

- Consider not building a fire at all. Use a camp stove for cooking.
- If you have a fire, use a fire pan that is large enough to contain the fire completely. Allow the ash to cool and then pack it out with the rest of your garbage. Select small pieces of driftwood or bring your own wood or charcoal.
- Do not construct rock rings or other structures.
- Carry and use a portable toilet for human waste.
