

Only YOU Can Keep This Access Open

ROADS AND TRAILS MAY NOT BE MAINTAINED OR PASSABLE. Roads and right-of-ways which access Bureau of Land Management (BLM) public lands in this area are subject to travel restrictions and seasonal closures. Obtain a travel map and inquire locally for current conditions. Travel at your own risk.

MOTOR VEHICLES MUST REMAIN ON DESIGNATED OPEN ROADS AND TRAILS ONLY. Cross-country travel is strictly prohibited. Please “*Tread Lightly*”.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS APPLY TO ALL PERSONS RECREATING WITHIN ¼ MILE OF THE RIVERS. The Willowa and Grande Ronde rivers are part of the *National Wild & Scenic Rivers* system and are designated *Oregon Scenic Waterways*. These rules are in place to protect and preserve the scenic beauty and natural features of the area, while providing for a variety of recreation activities and enhancing public health and safety. Your cooperation is essential for maintaining access and recreation opportunities on public lands in this area.

PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING RULES DURING YOUR VISIT

- All open fires must be completely contained in a fireproof container (“fire pan”) large enough to contain the fire completely. All ash, charcoal, and debris must be removed from the river corridor. Fires may not be left unattended. Seasonal fire restrictions may also apply.
- Portable toilet systems must be carried and used at all times when developed public toilet facilities are not available. No person shall leave, deposit, or scatter human waste, toilet paper, or items used as toilet paper, on the ground. Waste may only be disposed of at facilities provided for that purpose.
- Oregon ATV Permits are required on all off-highway vehicles. Information about ATV laws and regulations is available online at: www.oregonohv.org
- Obtain updated travel maps. Motor vehicles are allowed on designated open roads and trails only. Designated ATV trails are open to ATV’s and motorcycles 50 inches wide or less.
- Obey all posted signs and regulations. Check the bulletin boards for current information.
- Respect private property. Do not trespass.
- Motor vehicles are prohibited on railroad tracks and the railroad right-of-way. Do not operate ATV’s on, across, or near the railroad tracks or railroad right-of-way.
- Do not litter. Please take your garbage home with you.
- Camping on BLM land is limited to 14 days. Do not leave personal property unattended.
