


Wild Rogue River Noncommercial Off-Season Use Permit

Conditions of Use

1. Your signature as party leader affirms that the following conditions for a noncommercial permit have been met:
 - a. There is a bona fide sharing of expenses.
 - b. There are no fees collected in excess of the actual cost of the trip.
 - c. There is no financial gain by any member of the group.
 - d. No salary is directed from shared expenses of the trip.
 - e. No charge is collected for use of the equipment.
2. Party leader must: a) accompany the float craft on the entire river trip, b) carry this permit and display upon request of any authorized official and c) camp with the entire permitted group and have their float craft docked at the same campsite.
3. All open fires within 400 feet of the river must be contained in a firepan. All garbage and fire residue (ashes, charcoal) must be hauled out. A fire ring may not be used. Scavenged wood must be both dead and down.
4. Use of motors for propelling boats is only allowed from November 16 through May 14 between Grave Creek and Blossom Bar. Use of motors between Blossom Bar and Watson Creek requires a US Forest Service motorboat permit. An Oregon State Marine Board Motorboat permit with registration number must be displayed on motorized craft.
5. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices (PFD's) must be properly fitted and be readily accessible for each party member. Children 12 years and under must wear PFD's at all times. PFD's must be worn in class III rapids or greater by each person.
6. This permit is valid for 1 launch of 1 trip which may not exceed 7 days, including the launch date. Launches or ingress will be at Grave Creek boat ramp or above, and departures or egress will be at Foster Bar boat ramp or below.
7. An approved toilet system must be carried and available for inspection while on the river. The toilet must be set-up immediately and made available for use by all party members when stopping for any reason, for more than an hour, at a location without a government provided toilet. Disposal of solid human waste in other than an approved toilet system, or government provided toilet is prohibited.
8. Discharging of firearms or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property: a) in or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite or occupied area, b) across or on a body of water adjacent thereto, or c) in any manner or place whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage is prohibited from Forest Service administered land or waters and from September 16 to May 31 from BLM administered land or waters.
9. Possessing, discharging, or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device is prohibited.
10. Disturbing, removing, or damaging any natural feature or artifact is prohibited.
11. Individuals must comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, regulations, orders, postings or written requirements applicable to the area.
