Kids 7 and under complete page 1 - Kids 8 and older complete both pages 1 and 2

- 1) What tide pool creature is the Junior Ranger Badge shaped like?
- 2) What kind of whale might you see at Yaquina Head?
- 3) What should you do if you find a seal or seal pup on the beach?
- 4) What time is low tide today? (Hint: look at the “What’s on Today” board or tide chart)
- 5) Show a Ranger or Volunteer a whale, bird, or seal imitation. (Initials)
- 6) Ask a Ranger or Volunteer their name and one job they perform during the day.
- 7) Finish one of the puzzles or coloring sheets found at the Kids Corner.
- 8) Draw a picture of something new that you saw on this trip to Yaquina Head.

- 3) True or False: The Lighthouse has a first order Fresnel lens?

- 2) True or False: You are allowed to touch the tidepool creatures.

- 2) Where do Gray Whales migrate to in the spring?
- 3) List or draw three of the birds you might see here at Yaquina Head.
