BOBCAT-HOULIHAN TRAIL



TRAIL INFORMATION

The Bobcat-Houlihan Recreation Area provides access to several Shoshone National Forest trails of moderate to high difficulty.

The most clearly delineated of these trails is the Houlihan Loop Trail (shown in the larger map below). This is a 6.7 mile loop that connects the Bobcat and Houlihan drainages via the ridgeline, with a 2,250 ft. total elevation gain. Sections of this trail have been washed out by flash flooding and may be hazardous for horseback riding.

From the Houlihan Loop Trail, several other routes are accessible: the Houlihan Creek Trail that leads to the ridgeline northeast of Houlihan Creek; the Bobcat Creek Trail that follows along Bobcat Creek; and an Upper Loop. A completed Upper Loop (shown in the smaller map below) is 12.2 miles total with about 4500 ft. total elevation gain, and will pass near the base of Citadel Mountain.

Strong navigational and backcountry skills are recommended for these trails, as they may be unclear, unmarked and/or treacherous. Do not attempt hiking in this area without bear spray and bear safety training.


