Re: Protest of BLM Nevada's November 2019 Oil and Gas Lease Sale

To: Ms. Kemba Anderson, Branch Chief for Fluid Mineral Resources

Please accept and fully consider this protest of BLM Nevada's November 2019 lease sale.

I represent the 2,699 members of the Sierra Club in southern Nevada. We most strongly object to the leasing of over 547,959 acres of Nevada's public lands in the November oil and gas lease sale. Please see the attached list of parcel serial numbers.

These spectacular public lands are not appropriate for oil and gas leasing or development. These lands and waterways are home to sage grouse, mule deer, bighorn sheep and cutthroat trout. The November sale threatens established US Fish and Wildlife Service critical habitat of the threatened desert tortoise species. There are also parcels in close proximity to the Wayne Kirch Wildlife Management Area where there is established critical habitat of the Moorman White River springfish. Aquatic species here and throughout the proposed leasing areas are particularly sensitive to disturbances in hydrological resources.

The November sale flies in the face of the Department of Interior's Secretarial Order 3362, which prioritizes the protection of migration corridors, by offering for lease hundreds of parcels within these clearly identified priority migratory corridors.

For these reasons alone, the November sale is unacceptable and it is imperative that it be stopped.

Nevada has a robust outdoor economy that generates \$12.6 billion in consumer spending annually. Meanwhile, our oil and gas sales generate paltry sums in comparison. The Sierra Club's outings leaders use Nevada's public lands for our programs throughout the region.

The Elko County Commission released a study showing that "in Elko County 2006 through 2008 outdoor recreation generated an average of \$165 million annually in outdoor recreational uses through commercial retail sales, services, lodging and personal income." And "the personal income received by Elko County residents directly from employment in those businesses averaged over \$40 million." No doubt those numbers have only grown in the 10 years since then.

Another study by the National Park Service shows that "153,000 visitors to Great Basin National Park in 2018 spent \$8.8 million in communities near the park. That spending supported 121 jobs in the local area and had a

cumulative benefit to the local economy of \$9.0 million.” In the past two years, Nevada's BLM has offered a little over 1.4 million acres in oil and gas sales but has only sold 10% of those acres; 85% at the minimum bid of \$2 an acre. Oil and gas leasing has generated a little over \$400,000 from lease sales. In two years. This is NOT a good return on our investment.

The impact of gas and oil development on atmospheric warming and extreme weather events is even more frightening than the impacts to Nevada's water resources, wildlife and outdoor economy. Nevada has massive energy resources that do not contribute to atmospheric warming and extreme weather. In appropriate siting and management, Nevada's solar, wind and geothermal energy resources should be developed instead of any gas and oil.

This enormous lease, this egregious and unmitigatable impact to Nevada's lands, water and wildlife, the life-threatening boost to global warming must not happen.

## **RESOLUTION NUMBER 996**

### **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE OPPOSING BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT OIL AND GAS LEASE SALES IN THE REGION.**

**WHEREAS**, from time to time the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) makes available federal lands for oil and gas lease sale; and

**WHEREAS**, in order to propose parcels for lease and gas sales, the BLM must conduct a preliminary Environmental Analysis; and

**WHEREAS**, the Environmental Analysis process includes a public comment period; and

**WHEREAS**, the BLM has notified the public regarding a preliminary Environmental Analysis for a proposed oil and gas lease sale; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed oil and gas lease sale contains parcels that in located directly above the region's water system's aquifer supply (Basin 222) and up gradient from the direction of groundwater flow to the region's water sources; and

**WHEREAS**, all of the City of Mesquite (City) and the region's culinary water comes from Basin 222; and

**WHEREAS**, the Virgin Valley Water District (VVWD) is the City and region's water purveyor; and

**WHEREAS**, VVWD has formally submitted comments requesting that the BLM not allow any lease sales of parcels that could potentially impact their current and future water system; and

**WHEREAS**, the City recognizes the importance of natural resources to Nevada, but believes it is important to minimize adverse impacts of oil and gas resource development to the public's health, safety, and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, many of the chemicals injected during the development of oil and gas resources have documented adverse health effects and/or adverse environmental impacts; and

**WHEREAS**, there have been documented cases of water contamination near oil and gas sites, including people lighting their drinking water on fire; and

**WHEREAS**, there is no scientific research unequivocally proving that VVWD's current and future water system will not be adversely impacted by this oil and gas lease sale; and

**WHEREAS**, the pollution of water caused the development of oil and gas resources also threatens the long term economic well being of Mesquite residents, businesses and visitors, which are all dependent on clean drinking water.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Mesquite that the City does hereby oppose oil and gas lease sales in the region and the officers of the City are directed to take all actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution both now and for future lease sales.

**PASSED, ADOPTED AND APPROVED** by the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Nevada on the 13<sup>th</sup> of August, 2019.



## **RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE MOAPA BAND OF PAIUTES**

**Subject:** Oppose Bureau of Land Management proposal to allow oil and gas exploration of the traditional ancestral lands of the Southern Paiutes Peoples in the Ely District of Ely of the BLM for the November Lease Sale

**WHEREAS**, the Moapa Band of Paiutes are organized under the provisions of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, (Stat. 594), as amended to exercise certain rights of home rule and be responsible for the general welfare of its membership; and is governed by its Business Council which manages its affairs under Articles II and V of its Constitution: and

**WHEREAS**, the Moapa Business Council is the governing body of the Moapa Band of Paiute Indians, by authority of the Tribe's Constitution and By-Laws; and

**WHEREAS**, the region encompassing much of the Ely District of the Bureau of Land Management remain central to the lives of Native American Tribes. These lands are known to contain traditional and ceremonial use along with traditional gathering and collection locations for Native American people. The region contains abundant ecological resources and special places that are crucial in the continuity of Native American culture, religion and society; and

**WHEREAS**, the regions encompassing the Mountains and springs of Southern Nevada are considered sacred lands to the Southern Paiute Nuwu, where great legends were said to have begun and ended and where our hearts belong to this land. Since time immemorial our people have lived and traveled across these lands. They carved their stories on the rocks, cooked their food in the now ancient roasting pits, and left artifacts that show how our people thrived in this beautiful desert and mountain environment. These are the objects of antiquity that tell the story of the Nuwu; of how we thrived on the land and of how our homelands were stolen by the white colonizers. We cannot forget this history; and: The region contains abundant ecological resources and significant places that are crucial in the continuity of Paiute culture, religion and society; and

**WHEREAS**, much of the Ely District has not been properly inventoried for cultural resources and as a previous Draft Environmental Assessment of the Bureau of Land Management's 2015 Ely district sale acknowledged, less than 10% of the Ely District has been adequately inventoried for cultural resources; and

**WHEREAS**, the bighorn sheep are sacred to the Moapa people. Creation stories say that the Paiute people enter the mountains and left as sheep. In essence the sheep are people. It is our duty to protect the mountain sheep for if they die, then we die too. The November lease sale contains parcels affecting the Bighorn sheep populations of the Mormon Mountains Wilderness and the Tule Desert region which and are key habitat for desert bighorn sheep; and


**WHEREAS**, the potential oil and gas exploration in and around the Mormon Mountains Wilderness, the Tule Desert, the Clover Mountains Wilderness, the Delmar Range, the Meadow Valley Range, Basin and Range National Monument, and the Snake Mountain Range would be irreversibly damage groundwaters, ephemeral, perennial, annual springs, streams, and aquifers, wildlife habitat, and traditional gathering sites of the Moapa Band of Paiutes;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Governing council of the Moapa Band of Paiutes demands that the Bureau of Land Management not offer a single parcel of the traditional and ancestral lands of the Moapa Band of Paiute People in the Ely Distract for any Oil or Gas Leasing now or at any time in the future.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Bureau of Land Management increase coordination directly with the Moapa Band of Paiutes and all Indigenous Peoples to ensure the perpetual stewardship of their traditional lands, ensuring those future generations of Paiute Peoples will be able to maintain the continuity of Paiute culture, religion, history and society

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed March 2019, Oil and Gas Lease Sale. Great Basin National Park supports environmentally responsible energy development that does not result in direct or indirect impacts to park resources and values, including the scenic views specifically mentioned by Congress in the park's enabling legislation.

Public Law 99-565 established Great Basin National Park to "...preserve for the benefit and inspiration of the people a representative segment of the Great Basin of the Western United States possessing outstanding resources and significant geological and scenic values...". The views of and across the Snake, Spring, and Hamblin Valleys are extremely important for the benefit and inspiration of visitors. These views are also critical in fulfilling the park's purpose to interpret the Great Basin.

To address this issue, the Environmental Impact Statement and accompanying General Management Plan, for which the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) was a cooperating agency, called for interagency participation early and upfront that would allow the National Park Service (NPS) the opportunity to review, comment, and make recommendations concerning all Federally authorized proposals that might affect the visual integrity of the Snake, Spring, and Hamblin Valleys, as well as other shared Department of the Interior resources. These efforts should allow for the mitigation and minimization of potential impacts for informed decision making that better serves the public interest.

BLM Instruction Memorandum No. 2018-034, *Updating Oil and Gas Leasing Reform -- Land Use Planning and Lease Parcel Reviews*, allows the use of a Determination of NEPA Adequacy (DNA) if the action meets certain criteria. The park believes that in this case the draft DNA does not provide enough site specific information to make that determination.

The 2014 EA for Oil and Gas Leases analyzed 47,500 acres for leasing in the Hamblin Valley. The current map and Draft DNA indicate the 63,964 acres are currently being

considered for leasing in the same general area. At least 16,464 acres, or just over 25% of the proposed lease area, have not had NEPA analysis. It appears from the proposed leasing map that this is not an atypical example and that our comments below, while specific to the parcels closest to the park, equally apply throughout the district.

Section D (1.) of the draft DNA does not provide enough information on the geographic and resource conditions of the new areas (not covered under previous EA's) to determine if they are indeed similar to the acres previously analyzed.


Section D (3.) of the draft DNA does not provide any information regarding current or past rangeland health standard assessments for the new acres being considered. We note that the 2014 EA did not provide any information regarding rangeland health, except to indicate that assessments were being carried out. Given the four years of drought since the past EA, it is reasonable to consider that new information may be available for both previous and new areas.

Section D (4.) of the draft DNA does not provide any information on the cumulative effects of this leasing action. We believe that disclosing the total amount of new acres proposed for leasing, that are not covered by previous EAs, would be beneficial and necessary in determining the quantitative and qualitative effects of the current lease sale.

Section D (5.) of the draft DNA specifically asks about site-specific impacts. Given that in the Hamblin Valley alone there are 16,464 acres that have not been analyzed, we believe that the previous EA is not sufficient to determine potential site specific impacts on these new areas.

The November sale flies in the face of the Department of Interior's Secretarial Order 3362, which prioritizes the protection of migration corridors, by offering for lease hundreds of parcels within these clearly identified priority migratory corridors.

For these reasons alone, the November sale is unacceptable and it is imperative that it be stopped.

Nevada has a robust outdoor economy that generates \$12.6 billion in consumer spending annually. Meanwhile, our oil and gas sales generate paltry sums in comparison.

The Elko County Commission released a study showing that "in Elko County 2006 through 2008 outdoor recreation generated an average of \$165 million annually in outdoor recreational uses through commercial retail sales, services, lodging and personal income." And "the personal income received by Elko County residents directly from employment in those businesses averaged over \$40 million." No doubt those numbers have only grown in the 10 years since then.

Another study by the National Park Service shows that "153,000 visitors to Great Basin National Park in 2018 spent \$8.8 million in communities near the park. That spending supported 121 jobs in the local area and had a cumulative benefit to the local economy of \$9.0 million." In the past two years, Nevada's BLM has offered a little over 1.4 million acres in oil and gas sales but has only sold 10% of those acres; 85% at the minimum bid of \$2 an acre. Oil and gas leasing has generated a little over \$400,000 from lease sales. In two years. This is NOT a good return on our investment.

The impact of gas and oil development on atmospheric warming and extreme weather events is even more frightening than the impacts to Nevada's water resources, wildlife and outdoor economy. Nevada has massive energy resources that do not contribute to atmospheric warming and extreme weather. In appropriate siting and management, Nevada's solar; wind and geothermal energy resources should be developed instead of any gas and oil.

This enormous lease, this egregious and unmitigatable impact to Nevada's lands, waters and wildlife, the life-threatening boost to global warming must not happen.
