



Fire Prevention Order COS08-20-02 Stage 2 Fire Restrictions

Due to dry conditions and high fire danger, under authority of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (Title 43, United States Code, Section 1701, et. seq.) pursuant to Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 9212.2(a), the Bureau of Land Management is implementing fire restrictions for all public lands administered by the BLM Grand Junction Field Office in Mesa, Garfield, Delta and Montrose counties beginning at 12:01 a.m. on Friday August 14, 2020, including public lands within the McInnis Canyons National Conservation Area and that portion of the Dominguez-Escalante National Conservation Area within the Grand Junction Field Office.

Under Stage 2 Fire Restrictions, the following acts are prohibited:

- Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal barbecue, or grills are prohibited on federal lands. The use of portable stoves, lanterns using gas, jellied petroleum, or pressurized liquid fuel are permitted.
- Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
- Operating a chainsaw without a USDA or SAE approved spark arrester properly installed and working, a chemical fire extinguisher of not less than 8 ounces capacity by weight, and one round point shovel with an overall length of at least 36 inches.
- Using a welder, either arc or gas, or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.
- Using exploding targets.

Stage 2 Fire Restrictions are in addition to the following year-round wildfire prevention restrictions on BLM-administered public lands in Colorado:

- Leaving a fire unattended or unextinguished.
- Possessing, discharging, or using any fireworks.
- Discharging a firearm using incendiary or tracer ammunition.
- Burning, igniting, or causing to burn any tire, wire, magnesium, or any other hazardous or explosive material.
- Operating any off-road vehicle on public lands unless the vehicle is equipped with a properly installed spark arrester pursuant to 43 CFR 8343.1 (c).

The following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit or letter of authorization specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Persons using a fire fueled solely by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels.
3. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Violation of this Fire Prevention Order is punishable by a fine of not more than \$100,000, or imprisonment of not more than 12 months, or both. (43 CFR 9212.4 and 18 U.S.C. 3571). Restitution for total suppression and damage costs incurred will be borne by the violator.
