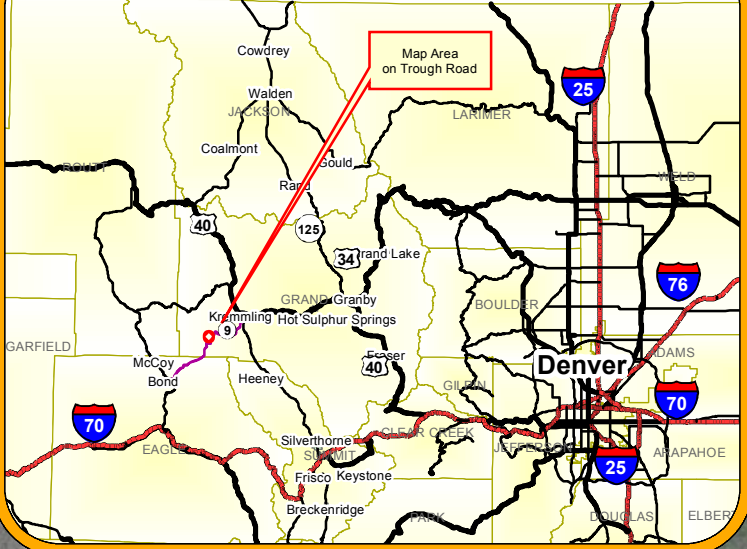


# Pumphouse Recreation Site Upper Colorado SRMA

## Individual Campsites:

- o Available on first-come, first-serve basis
- o 10 People Maximum, parking for about 2 vehicles (depending on size).
- o Campsites 1-8 have a 30-40 foot parking spur.
- o Campsites 9-18 have parking along side of road, not designed for RV/Trailer
- o \$10 per night, per site (May 1 to October 31), includes one vehicle. \$5 per extra vehicle.
- o 14 day limit; no electric or water hookups
- o Accessible campsites open to all if not reserved by 7 p.m.

## Group Campsites

- o Reservations can be made by calling the BLM Kremmling Field Office at 970-724-3000 or by visiting us on Highway 40 at the east end of Kremmling, CO, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- o Available on first-come, first-serve basis if not reserved.
- o 2 sites; maximum of 30 people per site
- o \$30 per night, per site (May 1 to October 31), includes 1 vehicle. \$5 per extra vehicle.
- o 14 day limit; no electric or water hookups

## Directions

Pumphouse is approximately 10 miles from Highway 9 on Grand County #1 (Trough Road). From Kremmling take Hwy 9 south about 1 mile to Grand County 1 (Trough Road). Go west on Grand County 1 (Trough Road) for 10 miles, and turn right onto Pumphouse access road.

18 individual campsites, 2 group campsites, 3 Boat Launches, Tables, Grills, Tent pads, Restrooms, Potable Water (summer months when available), Accessible Covered Picnic Area, Accessible Campsites, and more!

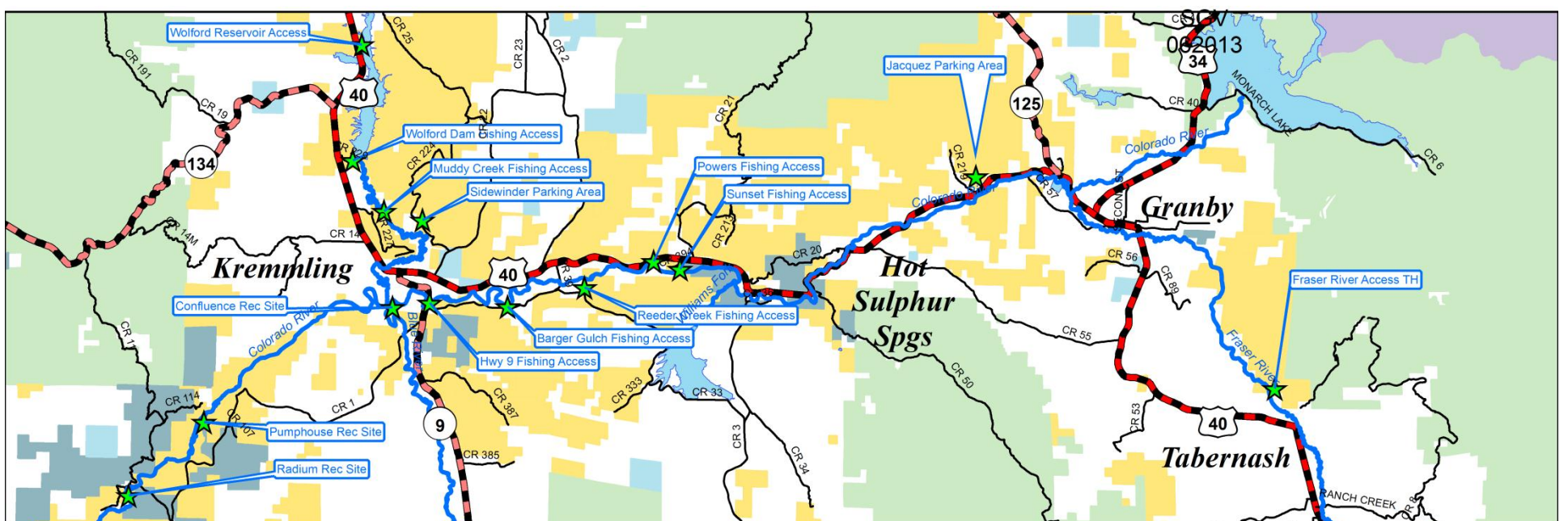
Reservations can ONLY be made for Group Sites, other sites are first come/first served.

## Rules Governing Developed Recreation Sites

1. Obey all posted traffic control signs and other regulatory signs.
2. You are required to purchase a use permit, and properly display that permit upon entry to the area. Follow the instructions on the bulletin board.
3. Camping is only allowed in designated campsites.
4. It is prohibited to reserve any individual campsite. You have 30 minutes to pay for the campsite after it is occupied. Group sites may be used if not reserved (see calendar).
5. Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 8 am.
6. You may not camp longer than 14 consecutive days.
7. You must not leave personal property unattended for more than 48 hours. Vehicles left parked for the purpose of overnight camping, hiking, river rafting or other authorized recreation activities are exempt.
8. Do not build any fire outside of a stove, grill, fire pan or BLM fire ring provided for such purpose. Do not build stone fire rings.
9. Do not move any table, stove, barrier, litter receptacle or other campground equipment, except for the portable picnic tables within the group camp sites.
10. Animals must be on a leash not longer than 6 feet, secured to a fixed object or under control of a person, or otherwise physically restricted at all times.
11. Do not clean fish, game, and other food, clothing or household articles at any outdoor hydrant.
12. Please use restrooms provided. Do not deposit human waste except in toilet facilities provided.
13. Do not deposit items into the vault toilets not intended for that purpose. It is extremely difficult to remove.
14. Motor vehicles shall only be driven on roads or places provided for that purpose.
15. Do not discharge or use firearms, other weapons, or fireworks within the developed recreation site/campground.
16. Individual campsites are limited to 10 people. Group campsites are limited to 30 people.

Please be courteous to others. Slow down, relax, and enjoy your public lands.
