Nick D.-Any update on COVID?

Sam B.-We did have a case that we believe came in from outside the plant. That person was in the control room and it looks like another person may have come in contact with the person who tested positive. We have 2 cases that have tested positive. That was last Friday. I have not heard of any other cases. Mark has there been any updates?

Mark M.-Yes, we have another operator that is planning to be tested soon. That will happen today.

Sam B.-I know Mark has been talking to Brad, but I have not heard anything from Brad about it for his folks.

Brad B.-The other operator that is possibly positive is it the night shift operator?

Mark M.-That is correct.

Nick D.-Brad do you have any comment on your protocols since you had people on site?

Brad B.-We got the email for the second employee and our folks were already off and we alerted them of the possible exposure. None of those off those had any symptoms.

Right now, we have just one employee that is reporting sinus drainage, but he has a lot of sinus problems, but he does not have any of the other symptoms, so we are still just being cautious.

Sam B.-We are setting up testing through the fire program so when something like this happens, we can get testing done quickly. Otherwise, it would be very hard for people to get tested.

Brad B.-One thing that came up is that we should really have a porta potty out there so our guys do not have to go inside each time.

Sam B.-That is something that we can easily do, that is a good suggestion Brad I will take that forward.

I do want to comment, Eric Hendrickson has moved up into the state lead role and he has had talks about the 95 masks and to see if we can have an exclusion. When the BLM uses those masks, it is a full-blown respiration system so there is not the support from the BLM to go to the 95 masks. That is the word we are getting is that it is not necessary to have the 95 masks in this situation. We continue to use the masks that are recommended for us, but I do not see the BLM supporting going to 95 masks.

Nick D.-Operational issues is next. We will turn it over to Mark.

Mark M.-Last week we did have some instability. It is just controlling the front-end temperature that is a problem. When it gets too cold the nitrogen goes too high and the chromatograph detects that, and it shuts us down. That occurred during the night and the back up pressure caused the K600 to go down and that just cascaded from there. We have some ideas on how to mitigate that we can get into that later. The pressure is 1013. It could down faster or slower going forward. We completed some maintenance while the plant was down. We could start up the plant, but we have another issue that we are working on. Xcel is going to do some maintenance on a breaker. We are trying to find out what the period of the maintenance is going to be. I was told between the 14th and 17th. We will get some more information on that or just make sure that we have the latest information.

Nick D.-My position is still restarting. I would encourage getting on with the Xcel folks today to get that figured out.

Sam B.-We will follow up with them Nick.

Nick D.-So covered several issues any questions or comments on anything else?
