

Seeking Volunteers

For Morley Nelson Snake River Birds of Prey National Conservation Area Long-term Habitat Restoration Project



Dedication Point is a Bureau of Land Management (BLM) recreation site that overlooks the Snake River Canyon, offering exceptional raptor viewing opportunities. It is the site of ongoing restoration projects to recover native sagebrush-steppe vegetation and improve habitat for raptors and their prey.

BLM is seeking dedicated volunteers to assist in a multi-year restoration project:

- 1) Weeding of annual invasive weeds (March-June).
- 2) Hand watering of planted native species (May-September)
- 3) Data collection and note-taking



Requiring a minimum of one season, but up to a two season commitment, visiting Dedication Point once every two to three weeks from May-September. The BLM will provide training and general supplies, and will incorporate wildlife viewings and other educational opportunities into the volunteer program.



The BLM participates in the interagency volunteer pass program. Volunteers who complete 250 hours will receive a one-year National Parks & Federal Recreation Lands Pass.
