## Petroglyphs in the Classroom-4th Grade

**What:** Invite a Park Ranger to teach students about petroglyphs.

**Activity**: Each student will make their own petroglyph, chipping paint off of a clay disc.

**Discuss**: The challenges of cross cultural communication as students interpret both their own and historic petroglyphs.

**Review:** The ranger shares free educational material with students who correctly answer questions about petroglyphs.




