


HUNTINGTON WAGON ROAD

WELCOME TO HISTORIC HUNTINGTON WAGON ROAD!

Walk on the Huntington Wagon Road and you follow the footsteps of the soldiers, adventurers and immigrants who passed this way before you. The Huntington Wagon Road is an easy 2-mile round trip hike that includes trees blazes and a historic campsite. Other unmarked routes along the way offer extra loops to explore.



KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- ✓ **OPEN YEAR ROUND** with no fees.
- ✓ **TRAIL IS OPEN** to horse, foot, and mountain bike travel. No motorized vehicles.
- ✓ **TRAIL IS NOT** ADA accessible. No overnight camping, restrooms, or water.
- ✓ **PETS ALLOWED** under owner control. **NO FIREARMS** to include paintball guns.
- ✓ **PROTECT CULTURAL RESOURCES** and leave artifacts such as arrowheads and blazed trees in their place.

DIRECTIONS

The trail is located 5 miles northeast of Bend. Exit Hwy 97 at Deschutes Market Rd. and follow signs to Deschutes Market Rd – continue to the intersection with Dale Rd and turn left (east). Travel 0.8 miles to McGrath Rd and turn right. Follow McGrath for 1.3 miles to a parking area on the right after the cattle guard.


POINT OF INTEREST
