

BLM Type Definitions

Type 1-Federally listed Threatened or Endangered Species and Critical Habitat

Federally listed Threatened or Endangered Species and designated Critical Habitat.

Type 2- Rangewide/Globally Imperiled Species-High Endangerment

These are species that have a high likelihood of being listed in the foreseeable future due to their global rarity and significant endangerment factors. Species also include; USFWS Proposed and Candidate species, ESA species delisted during the past 5 years, ESA Experimental Non-essential species, and ESA Proposed Critical Habitat.

Type 3 - Range-wide or State-wide Imperiled - Moderate Endangerment

These are species that are globally rare or very rare in Idaho, with moderate endangerment factors. Their global or state rarity and the inherent risks associated with rarity make them imperiled species.

Type 4- Species of Concern

These are species generally rare in Idaho with small populations or localized distribution and currently have low threat levels. However, due to the small populations and habitat area, certain future land uses in close proximity could significantly jeopardize these species.
