

Planning Subcommittees on the John Day – Snake RAC

The 15-member John Day – Snake Resource Advisory Council (JDSRAC) was chartered to provide information and advice regarding the use and development of the lands administered by the BLM and Forest Service in central and eastern Oregon. Members represent an array of stakeholder interests in the land and resources from within the local area and statewide.

The JDSRAC has a subcommittee to research additional information on selected topics in between full committee meetings. These can be common long-standing issues such as weeds or recreation, or can be more time-sensitive issues such as responses to a project proposal or a review of an environmental document.

The role of the subcommittee is to compile facts and information about a topic, query the relevant federal agency for additional information, review public input, summarize environmental assessments and/or resource managements or issues, and bring recommendations or discussion points forward to the full JDSRAC.

No decisions will be made at the subcommittee level. Each topic will have a federal liaison who will attend the call, take minutes, and publish these minutes to the JDSRAC webpage at <https://www.blm.gov/get-involved/resource-advisory-council/near-you/oregon-washington/john-day-rac>. All meetings, including subcommittee meetings, are open to the public in their entirety.
