BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT EXPLANATION OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2010 FIRE PROGRAM ANALYSIS INTERAGENCY GUIDANCE

- Page 2 of 8, Analysis Guidance, Section 1. "Support Components" are defined as support positions (e.g., contracting specialist, geographic information system analyst, wildlife biologist, etc.) and facilities operation and maintenance.
- Page 3 of 8, Analysis Guidance, Section 2. The terms "assigned current" and "current" are synonymous and interchangeable.
- Page 3 and 4 of 8, Analysis Guidance, Section 2.a. (Preparedness). The term "program component" is defined as "production resources" (i.e., those resources capable of producing fire line including engines, hand crews, etc.) and the prevention program.
- Page 3 of 8, Analysis Guidance, Section 2.a.i. The Fiscal Year (FY) 2009 assigned levels of funding numbers to be used for the FY 2010 analysis were provided by the Bureau of Land Management Fire Office of Budget and Evaluation (F A-400) to the Fire Program Analysis (FPA) project in August of 2009. This information was then distributed by the FPA project to Geographic Area leads based on Fire Planning Units (FPU).
- Page 5 of 8, Investment Options and Alternatives, 4th paragraph. To better understand model sensitivity and prepare for potential future analyses, the FPA project may solicit volunteers to examine additional plus/minus budget options. While participation is voluntary, it is encouraged that all interagency FPU partners participate, provided that the participation does not compromise their FPU submission by April 15, 2010 deadline.
- Page 7 of 8, Geographical Area (GA) Review. While the FPU reviews by the GA should occur and be documented prior to analysis submission, the documentation by the GA review team of "their general observations regarding the FPU reviews" does not need to occur until after the FPU reviews have been completed.
