Explore the Great Outdoors- Investigating Red Rock Canyon Teacher Workshop

Would you like to explore Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area with your students? Get your students moving outdoors and explore the wonderful world of nature.

Exploring the Great Outdoors will provide content on cultural aspects of Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area, the different life zones in the area, an overview of geology, and the water cycle as it pertains to the Las Vegas area and the Spring Mountain Range.

We will explore a short trail in the Conservation Area. The participants will become familiar with procedures of scheduling field trips to the Red Rock Canyon area. At the end of this course, participants will be able to identify available resources, web-based literature and hands-on materials available to enhance field trip experiences.

This workshop is required for those who want to bring students to explore a trail in Red Rock Canyon on your own and potentially qualify for transportation grants.

Participants will be in the field during a portion of this course. Dress appropriately for weather conditions, be prepared to be outside, and bring water and a picnic lunch. There is no food available for purchase on site.
