# **Frequently Asked Questions:**

## 1. How do I get a bidder number?

You will need to complete an <u>adoption application</u> (attached) and get it signed by a BLM official. Kevin Lloyd (<u>kloyd@blm.gov</u>) or Juley Smith (<u>jhsmith@blm.gov</u>) can help you with any questions about the applicaton. Either of them can be reached by phone at 208-524-7500, and will be at the fairgrounds all day Friday Sept. 11 and Saturday Sept. 12. You cannot bid on a mustang without an approved adoption application and bidder number!

### 2. How much do the horses cost?

The mustangs are adopted through a competitive bid auction. The minimum bid is \$125.00, and goes up from there. Of that, \$25 goes to the BLM and everything over that goes to the 4-H club.

#### 3. Do you take credit cards?

No. If you are bidding on a mustang, please bring checks or cash to the adoption. Also, be prepared to write two checks- one to the BLM and the other to the 4-H club, as the funds are handled separately.

## 4. Can I preview the horses before the adoption?

YES!!! The horses will be at the fairgrounds Friday Sept. 11 and all day Saturday Sept. 12 participating in a Trail Challenge and Freestyle show before the adoption. Come see the great work these 4-H'ers have put into their mustangs!

#### 5. Are COVID safety precautions in place?

YES! We are fortunate to have a large open air facility to host our shows and adoption, but please be mindful of the Bonneville County COVID-19 safety measures, which include maintaining at least 6 foot spacing between your family and others, wearing a mask, and washing/sanitizing hands as often as possible.

## 6. What happens next if I win the bid for a mustang?

CONGRATULATIONS! First, we want to get a photo of you with your new mustang and 4-H trainer in the arena. Second, we will need to fill out the adoption contract (called a PMACA) and receive the money. Third, we will help you load the horse into your trailer. Please either bring a trailer or make arrangements to haul the horse SATURDAY after the adoption. Thank you for supporting our 4-H trainers and adopting a Living Legend!
