Criteria for Determining Oregon/Washington Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service Region 6 Sensitive Species June 21, 2021

To confer Sensitive status within a state, the following criteria must be met within the state.

Sensitive

- 1. All US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Candidate species are sensitive within the state where suspected¹ or documented on lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) or Forest Service (FS).
- 2. All de-listed USFWS or NOAA species are sensitive within the state where suspected or documented on BLM/FS lands for the longer of five years or the duration of their delisting monitoring plans.
- 3. All Oregon Department of Agriculture, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife state threatened or endangered species where documented on BLM/FS lands (not suspected only) and which are not state extirpated (SX) or historic (SH) in the state.

For all other taxa, the following four criteria must be met:

- 1. On the Oregon Biodiversity Information Center (ORBIC) List 1 or 2 or Washington Natural Heritage Program (WNHP) rare species lists except Review Group 1 or 2 (see below for acronyms and lists) with NatureServe ranks of:
 - a. S1, S1S2, S1S3, S2, or S2S3 or
 - b. S2S4 or S3 and G1-G3, G1Q-G3Q, N1-N3, or T1-T3
- 2. Sensitive taxa must be documented on at least one FS or BLM unit in the state where status is being evaluated.
- 3. Sensitive taxa must be fully described with valid scientific names (i.e., no undescribed). In addition, botanical forms (forma) do not qualify as sensitive.
- 4. To be added as sensitive, lichens, bryophytes, fungi, and invertebrates must have a completed ISSSSP species fact sheet.

Acronyms

NatureServe Network Global (G), National (N), and Subnational (State/Province) (S) Ranks

- 1 = Critically imperiled
- 2 = Imperiled
- 3 = Rare and uncommon; vulnerable.
- 4 =Not rare and apparently secure

NatureServe Rank Qualifiers:

¹ Suspected = habitat is expected to occur on FS/BLM lands and surveys have not been thorough or recent enough to determine presence/non-presence.

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 $\#X\# = Range \ rank - a \ numeric \ range \ rank \ (e.g., G2G3, G1G3)$ is used to indicate uncertainty about the exact status of a taxon

Q = Questionable taxonomy

Washington Natural Heritage Program (WNHP) Plant Lists

- R1 = Review group 1; plants of potential concern for which current information is insufficient to evaluate conservation status.
- R2 = Review group 2; plants of potential concern but with unresolved taxonomic questions.

Oregon Biodiversity Information Center (ORBIC) List

- 1 = Taxa are threatened with extinction or presumed to be extinct throughout their entire range.
- 2 = Taxa are threatened with extirpation or presumed to be extirpated from the state of Oregon; these are often peripheral or disjunct species which are of concern when considering species diversity within Oregon's borders.
