



Temporary Wildlife Special Action WSA21-01




- Requests that caribou and moose hunting on Federal public lands in Units 23 and 26A be closed to non-Federally qualified users Aug. 1 – Sept. 30, 2022.
- Originally submitted for the 2021 hunting season.
- Decision deferred by the Board in June 2021.
- Western Arctic Caribou Herd numbers at 188,000 animals in 2021, down from 244,000 animals in 2019.

Game Management Unit 23



Wildlife Special Action 21-01 requests lands in Unit 23 be temporarily closed to non-federally qualified (urban) hunters.

Game Management Unit 26



Wildlife Special Action 21-01 requests lands in Unit 26a be temporarily closed to non-federally qualified (urban) hunters. BLM manages ~25 million acres in Unit 26a.
