#### **BLM related proposals and special actions**

- One Temporary Wildlife Special Action (WSA22-01)



# BLM-related Wildlife Proposal (WP) highlights

- WP22-01 and WP22-02: revised regulations governing individual harvest limits and designated hunting in communities with a community harvest system
- WP22-47: requested allowing for the harvest of caribou calves in Unit 22
- WP22-49: requested that the Federal lands closure to moose hunting by NFQU be rescinded in Unit 22 North
- WP22-54: requested modification of a hunt area boundary for moose in Unit 26A

#### **Temporary WSA22-01**

- Submitted by the BLM and National Park Service
- Requested revision of the way in which the hunt for muskox was administered in Units 22 and 23

 Requested standardizing the language in the Delegation of Authority Letters for these hunts

#### **Temporary WSA22-02**

- Submitted by the Western Interior Subsistence Regional Advisory Council
- Requests that Dall's sheep hunting on Federal public lands in Unit 24A and Unit 26B, west of the Sagavanirktok River be closed to all users for the 2022-2024 wildlife regulatory cycle
- Severe declines in Dall's sheep population in recent years along with very poor lamb production and very few legal rams available for harvest
- Authority for closure to all users in ANILCA Section 816(b)
- Board will meet June 22<sup>nd</sup> to deliberate and make a final decision



#### **Update on Temporary WSA21-01**

- Board voted to close Noatak National Preserve (including the Nigu River portion of the Preserve in GMU 26A) and BLM-managed lands between the Noatak and Kobuk rivers in Unit 23 to caribou hunting by non-Federally qualified users from Aug. 1-Sept. 30 during the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 regulatory years and all Federal public lands in Unit 23 to moose hunting for the same time period.
- Original request was to close caribou and moose hunting on Federal public lands in Units 23 and 26A to non-Federally qualified users Aug. 1 to Sept. 30, 2022.
- Proponents were concerned that sport hunters were deflecting the migratory route of the Western Arctic Caribou Herd (WACH) away from villages, preventing rural hunters from harvesting caribou.
- Decision deferred by the Board in June 2021.
- Western Arctic Caribou Herd numbers at 188,000 animals in 2021, down from 244,000 animals in 2019.
