Baker Hot Springs



Improvements for visitors at Baker Hot Springs

Baker Hot Springs, located west of the Intermountain Power Plant, off Brush Wellman Highway, has become a popular recreation site for people who love to soak in hot springs. Due to the increased number of visitors to the area, the BLM determined that a new restroom facility was needed for public health and safety purposes. The BLM operations crew was able to install a new restroom using recreation fee funds for a total project cost of \$22,411.

Topaz Mountain



Improvements at Rock Hounding Site

Topaz Mountain is a popular rock hounding area located off Brush Wellman Highway. Since FY20, there has been an increased flow of traffic to the area. The BLM determined that a new restroom was needed for public health and safety purposes. The BLM operations crew was able to install a new restroom using recreation fee funds in the amount of \$10,637. The project was completed using \$11,744 from other funding sources.

Recreation Fee Dollars

They support and enhance:

- Maintenance, repair, and facility enhancement related directly to visitor enjoyment, visitor access, and health and safety
- Interpretation, visitor information, visitor service, visitor needs assessments, and signs
- Habitat restoration directly related to wildlife- dependent recreation that is limited to hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, or photography
- Law enforcement related to public use and recreation, including direct operating or capital costs associated with the recreation fee program

Recreation fee dollars are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations benefit as 100% of the funds collected are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.



Other Accomplishments

- Pumping and cleaning of the restroom at Miller's Canyon.
- Employees cleaned and restocked new restrooms at Topaz Mountain, Baker Hot Springs, and Lava Tubes.
- SRP's for the motorcycle races were monitored by riding and marking the course.
- SRP's in the field office were monitored for compliance.
- Roads were repaired after flooding at Little Sahara.
- New cattle guard was installed on white sands road.
- Contracts were used for restroom cleaning garbage services at Little Sahara.
