National Public Lands Day with SUWA

Westwater Ranger Station is a remote field station on the Colorado River. Park rangers constantly juggle travel management and visitor needs. There are numerous motorized singletrack trails and the Kokopelli's Trail in the Utah Rims SRMA. We partnered with SUWA for the second year to conduct a project in Westwater Canyon, cleaning the river corridor of tires and other non-natural debris. We also installed a new culinary well to provide potable water to staff and visitors.

Day Use Shade Shelter on the Colorado River

Lower Onion Creek is a campground and a popular launching location for commercial and private river runners. It is especially popular in low water. A dayuse shelter was needed for groups that have lunch and are waiting for their guides to rig or a shuttle to return. Day users were impacting the group site shelters and creating unnecessary conflicts. Our maintenance crew constructed this of wood to match the three existing shelters in this location and expanded the parking area.

Recreation Fee Dollars

Recreation fee dollars are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations benefit as 100% of the funds collected are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value. They support and enhance:

- Maintenance, repair, and facility enhancement related directly to visitor enjoyment, visitor access, and health and safety
- Interpretation, visitor information, visitor service, visitor needs assessments, and signs
- Habitat restoration directly related to wildlife- dependent recreation that is limited to hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, or photography
- Law enforcement related to public use and recreation, including direct operating or capital costs associated with the recreation fee program



Other Accomplishments

- Patrols of the river corridor and uplands in the Utah Rims Special Recreation Management Area.
- Coordination with Ruby Horsethief boaters and staff.
- Toilet pumping and dumpsters at Westwater & Cisco.
- Monthly Wilderness Study Area patrols & monitoring.
- Install ice machine & washer/dryer at Westwater Ranger Station.
- Designation of new camp at Otter Bar.
- Continued revegetation work at Bald Eagle camp and tire clean-ups in the canyon.

Connecting with Communities

The Moab Field Office works with commercial river Special Recreation Permit holders to provide access to the Colorado, Green and Dolores Rivers.
