Recreation Fee Program Spending & Accomplishment Highlights 2021

Mountain Bike Championship

We hosted the Utah High School Mountain Bike Championship with 1,363 participants and 3,500 support folks, coaches, families, and volunteers at the Moab Brands trailhead. This hugely successful event requires a large staging area for the teams and their box trailers. Spectator parking occurs on adjacent private lands. It is exhilarating to see the teens compete and listen to the heartwarming stories shared by their families.

Adventure Elopements & Weddings

The COVID-19 pandemic accelerated the desire to have weddings and adventure elopements in stunning locations such as Moab. We went from only a handful to 36 SRPs that authorize commercial guiding, logistical organizing, livery and photography for adventure elopements and weddings. We worked closely with SRP holders to identify appropriate locations. Our Recreation Division had a workday to install the post and cable fencing in the picture to prevent unwanted expansion of this large scenic parking area popular for these activities.

Recreation Fee Dollars

Recreation fee dollars are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations benefit as 100% of the funds collected are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value. They support and enhance:

- Maintenance, repair, and facility enhancement related directly to visitor enjoyment, visitor access, and health and safety
- Interpretation, visitor information, visitor service, visitor needs assessments, and signs
- Habitat restoration directly related to wildlife- dependent recreation that is limited to hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, or photography
- Law enforcement related to public use and recreation, including direct operating or capital costs associated with the recreation fee program



Other Accomplishments

- Administered & monitored more than 400 SRPs
- Replaced chain on Corona Arch trail to improve visitor experience & safety
- Maintained & expanded trailheads
- Installed metal toilet at Fruit Bowl with a \$6,000 donation from Slackline US
- Partnered with National Park Service for canyoneering etiquette video
- Managed five assistance agreements
- 22 volunteer trail projects with Grand County partners, Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance, Wilderness Volunteers, American Hiking Society, Jeep & other groups
- Installed new signs in the BLM visual design standard at trailheads & campgrounds
- Monitored Wilderness Study Areas
- Implemented the travel management plan
